

DEBATE PAGE: POCKET MONEY



Instructions for Teachers: Step 1 is done in two separate groups. Each group can see only their own information. Try to see Linda's/ mother's point of view. Then do Step 2. Get both groups together and see each other's view of the problem. Try to find a solution.

Step 1

Student A

Linda: I Want More Pocket Money...

Hi, my name is Linda and I'm thirteen years old. My problem is money. First, I don't think I get enough pocket money from my parents. I never seem to have as much money as my friends. If I ask Mum for more, she says it doesn't matter how much I get because I will spend it anyway. And that's the second part of my problem. When I have money, I spend it very fast. Mum says I have to learn to save and be more

responsible. Is it even possible to learn that?!

I've even heard that she borrows money from her friends. She gets all she needs at home - food, school supplies, clothes. I don't think we should give her more. And she definitely should not spend that much! We are very worried.




