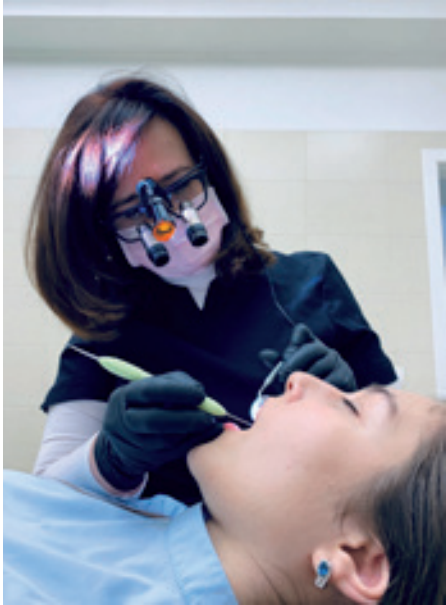

Student A

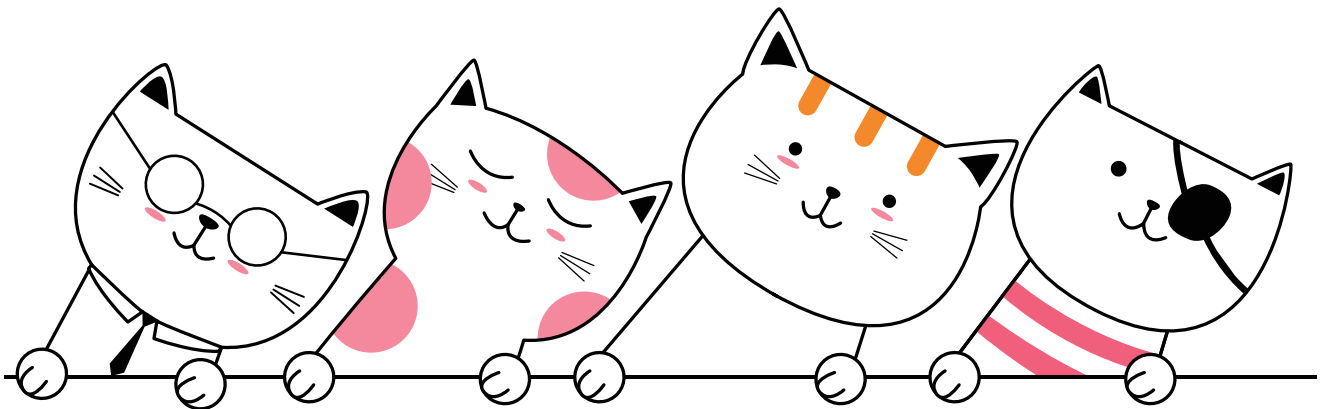
