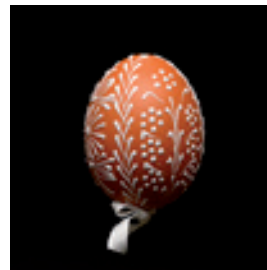

Instructions for teachers: **Step 1** is done in two separate groups. Each group can see only their own information. Try to see Nina's/ the teacher's point of view. Then do **Step 2**. Get both groups together and see each other's view of the problem. Try to find a solution.



Step 1

Student A

Nina: I'm too shy. What shall I do?

'Hello, my name is Nina and I'm 14 years old. I'm very shy and that is my problem. I like talking to my friends and family BUT when I need to talk to adults it's a disaster! I don't know what to say. I feel hot and red. It is so embarrassing! I cannot talk to teachers. I cannot ask for help in shops. I cannot ask strangers about anything. The other day I met my friend's mum on the bus. She was very nice to me but I just had this big lump in my throat and didn't know what to say. When I was leaving, instead of saying 'goodbye' I said 'happy birthday'. She looked shocked and I just ran! What shall I do?'

Step 1

Student B

Teacher: We are so worried about Nina.

Nina is a very nice girl and when she doesn't know an adult is around, she is merry and witty. Unfortunately, as soon as I or other teachers talk to her, she panics and can't squeeze out a word. We do our best but nothing has really helped so far. We don't examine her but let her write her answers. I see she has friends so maybe I'll try to let her do work in pairs. I think her parents should try some steps, too. For example she could bring a small plush toy to school. It might help her. She should also prepare some questions and answers beforehand and actively try them on me or other teachers she likes. She should go to the shops every day and buy a thing just to try and talk. I'm so sorry for her.

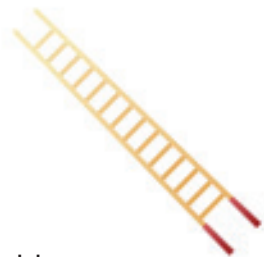

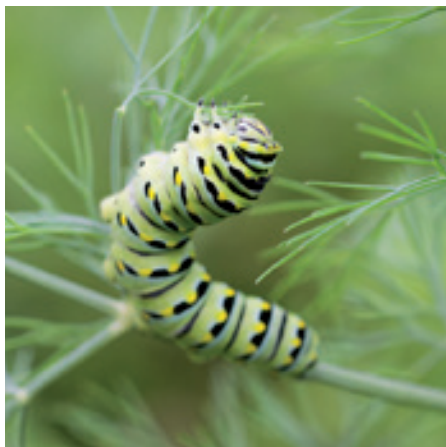

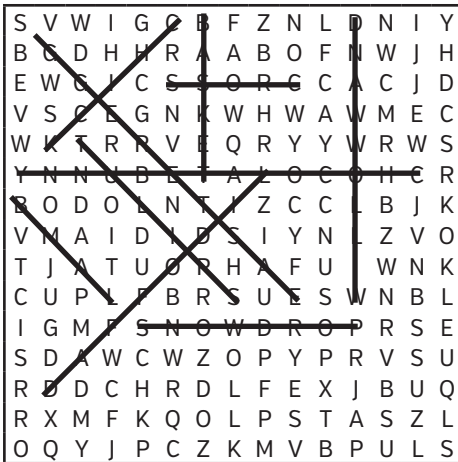
